The undergraduate major consists of at least 27 hours of course work in religious studies. Fifteen of the total hours required must be taken in courses numbered 300 and above, and eight of these junior-senior hours must be completed in residence at the University. Each student must take REL 104, REL 124, and REL 490 (Senior Seminar in Theories and Methods) which is normally offered only during the spring semester. Majors are advised to enroll in Required Courses (REL 104, and REL 124) early in their course work. They should plan to take REL 490 during either their junior or senior year during the spring semester. A student must complete all required courses and at least one course from each of the three categories in Curricular Distribution Requirements (Section II) and at least three additional elective courses (Section III).
